The Career

Depending on the size of the facility, medical billing and coding can be one job or it may be distinguished as two separate jobs. The job of the medical biller entails knowing the methods of billing patients, understanding various collection methods, completing medical billing and claim forms, and coding. Medical billers must know how to explain charges and communicate effectively with patients and insurance companies.

Medical coders assign a code to each diagnosis and procedure on claim forms that are submitted to health insurance companies. Codes exist for all types of medical encounters, services, tests, treatments, and procedures provided in a medical office, clinic, or hospital. Classification manuals and software programs assist medical coders in doing their job efficiently.

Job Opportunities

Medical billers and coders—often called health information technicians—can utilize their skills in a variety of healthcare facilities including hospitals, nursing homes, medical group practices, clinics, and home health agencies. Other settings that may employ health information technicians are insurance firms and public health departments. Additional opportunities exist for home employment.

Employment Outlook

As insurance and governmental regulations become more complex and the U.S. population ages, the demand for medical billing and coding professionals continues to rise. Health information technology is one of the 20 fastest growing occupations in the United States. This career field is expected to grow by 15%, much faster than the average for all occupations through 2024, due to rapid growth in the number of medical tests, treatments, and procedures which will be increasingly scrutinized by third-party payers, regulators, courts, and consumers.

What You Can Earn

Many factors are considered when calculating salary for medical billing and coding specialists such as location, job title, education level and years of experience. According to the U.S. Dept. of Labor, Bureau of Labor and Statistics, those working in a Medical Billing & Coding career earned up to \$61,400 annually.

Certification

Graduates of Blackstone's Medical Billing & Coding program are qualified to sit for the Certified Coding Associate (CCA) exam administered by the American Health Information Management Association (AHIMA), well as the Certified Medical Reimbursement Specialist (CMRS) as exam from the American Medical Billing Association (AMBA).
